Pivot Point by Ucaoimhu

Just as this party involving a palindrome (44) has a palindromic date (10-01), this puzzle is palindromic in a few different ways:

- (1) In seven Down clues the wordplay yields a letter string with one wrong letter; 19 Down is ambiguous, with two possible answers (two clues intersecting it are thus also ambiguous), and which letter is wrong depends on which answer you get. Either way, the seven wrong letters, left to right in the grid, will say what caused this party to be rescheduled. Also, if a wrong letter is the *n*th letter, take all the direction letters (N, S, E, W) in that clue's *n*th word, and draw a path as per these directions linking centers of squares, starting in the answer's *n*th square; use *both* of 19D's possible wrong letters. (Paths may overlap themselves and each other.) All eight paths together, **held up to a mirror**, will show a palindromic name employing a nonstandard letter.
- (2) "Palindrome" is also the name of a Mystery Hunt team, so the nonstandard letter (formed by 19D's two paths) must be assigned encodings in a couple of standard Hunt codes:

Numbers. Each 19D path is a standard lowercase letter *before* mirror-reflection; sum their numeric (a = 1, b = 2) codes to get a new numeric code for the nonstandard letter.

Maritime. The nonstandard letter will get a new maritime flag code that is the "average" of the codes for those two standard letters. To remind you of their codes, choosing either answer for 19D allows you to color each 44-square segment of the grid the same color as one answer in it, so the whole grid forms the flag code for the corresponding standard letter. Also, 20 clues each have one incorrect character you must alter before solving; in clue order, the incorrect characters will describe the "average" code more specifically. (The correct characters will spell out an appropriate message, employing the nonstandard letter.)

(3) Six Across and six Down clues remain that are not alluded to above; each one's answer must be altered before entry:

Maritime numbers. In each such Down answer, change a body of water to "number." (All bodies of water are of the same type; in alphabetical order, they are in eastern Europe, the southwest US, Siberia, central Europe, southern Europe, and West Africa.)


Held up to a mirror. In each such Across answer, move the letter in second-from-last position to the second position, and where it is the *x*th-from-last letter in *our new alphabet with the nonstandard letter appended*, change it to the *x*th letter.

(Altered entries will include an abbreviation and a demonym. Also, each such clue contains a straight clue to the altered entry.)

Finally, to get the name of the nonstandard letter, take the name from the message in (2), and apply both changes to it in order.
