IX/XV by Ucaoimhu

As in today's date, for each Across clue an I must move later, becoming a V, either (a) in the answer before entry or (b) in a word in the clue before solving (three (a) entries will be proper nouns/noun phrases, and in each (a) clue is a straight clue to its entry.) If I moves *n* places, note the *n*th *character* from the clue's (a) start or (b) end. Those for (a) and for (b) will each be a timespan; sum them to get the time since an alarm.

Each Down clue's wordplay yields a letter string where one letter has moved to the (a) top or (b) bottom and maybe changed; put the original letter in the pentagon that matches its direction of motion and "new" letter, and put the *clue*'s (a) start or (b) end letter in the square box. The rows of boxes will describe (at the time of the alarm) the first four letters in the (a) and (b) timespan respectively; the pentagons will say what I-shaped items notably become V-shaped around here.
